Students will have a limited amount of time to complete work. One day per day missed from class. Excessive
amounts of missing work result in removal from CDT.
I understand that CDT / BTW rosters are generated based on student eligibility (8 classes passed/2 semesters) AND Date of Birth (DOB). Deviation from this procedure MAY be the result of student's sched. conflicts and/or availability.
DE GOOD PRACTICE is to roster CDT students who will turn 15 years of age during the assigned CDT course (students MAY BE 15 prior to enrollment)
Driving permits are not issued until: 1. Written test is passed, 2. Vision Exam is passed, 3. Payment of \$20 to Sec. of State (SOS), 4. Payment of \$150 to HHS and 5. Student turns 15 years of age 6. Grade and Attendance expectations are met (no more than 2 absences and a grade higher than "C" at the time of written test)
The fee for DE at HHS is \$150 (paid ONLY once even if a student has to take CDT or BTW more than once). This fee may be waived for school year participation ONLY Summer CDT/BTW fees cannot be waived.
IL state law requires that students log at least 50 hours of BTW training with a parent/guardian. 10 of these hours must be nighttime driving. This "LOG" must be certified by parent/guardian signature and submitted when the student driver applies for an Illinois License.
A parent/guardian may revoke consent for the minor to hold a driver's license/driver's permit at any time, for any reason, until the driver turns 18. Please know that reinstatement requires the driver/parent/guardian to re-apply, pay appropriate fees and pay a reinstatement fee. The parent/guardian will contact S.O.S. of their intent to revoke (not HHS)
Student drivers MUST maintain a valid driver's permit for at least 9 months before they are able to apply for a driver's license at the legal age.
A driver's permit is good for UP TO 2 years expiration date listed on driver's permit card
Student drivers MUST have their driving permit on them during every driving lesson (failure = absences)
Student drivers MUST be able to provide SOS with the following documents when applying for a permit: Birth Certificate (official), Social Security Card, Parent/Guardian Driver's License (same address) and Application for the Permi (signed by DE instructor and Parent/Guardian) I suggest you locate these items prior to your child taking the written test.
Student drivers who are able to achieve an "A" or "B" in both phases (CDT & BTW) will have the opportunity to take an OFFICIAL ROAD EXAM with a HHS DE instructor. Please know that the student driver may have to take the road exam with a DMV official for the following reasons: 1. Not meeting academic requirements, 2. Per DE instructor request 3. Parent/Student request or 4. Due to DMV "SPOT-CHECK."
Student drivers must not acquire ANY driving convictions during the nine-month permit phase before applying for an IL driver's license. A moving violation conviction results in a 9 mo waiting period before applying for a license
A driving permit allows student drivers to have as many passengers as seat belts (not in front seats), HOWEVER the person sitting next to the student driver MUST BE 21+ years old with a valid license (not impaired).
Cell phone use while driving (<u>including hands free</u>) is prohibited for ALL drivers under age 19
Driving without a permit results in being ineligible to obtain a driver's license until age 18
Permit drivers (under 18) who violates driving nighttime curfews may have their privileges suspended Nighttime restrictions: (Sun-Thurs): 10pm-6am (Fri–Sat): 11pm-6am (check with local restrictions)
First year of licensing, a driver may only have 1 non-related person in the car under age 20
ONCE 16 YEARS OLD AND POSSESSING AN IL DRIVER'S LICENSE, if 2 moving violations (tickets) are issued within a 24 mo period will result in a 1 mo suspension of your license. Additional time will be tacked on for each moving violation following the initial suspension.

_Suspended drivers must attend a remedial education course, may be retested and must pay a \$70 reinstatement fee.
